From Pastor Bryan

Now there was a Pharisee, a man named Nicodemus who was a member of the Jewish ruling council. He came to Jesus at night and said, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God. For no one could perform the signs you are doing if God were not with him." Jesus replied, "Very truly I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God unless they are born again." "How can someone be born when they are old?" Nicodemus asked. "Surely they cannot enter a second time into their mother's womb to be born!" Jesus answered, "Very truly I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless they are born of water and the Spirit. Flesh gives birth to flesh, but the Spirit gives birth to spirit. You should not be surprised at my saying, 'You must be born again.' John 3:1 – 7 NIV

We have "bumped" into Nicodemus several times over the last few weeks of Lent and we will bump into him again on Good Friday when we witness the completion of the rebirth that Jesus is alluding to in this scripture. Nicodemus is a smart man, a Pharisee and member of the ruling council, but he has some spiritual baggage, some spiritual clutter in his life that he feels compelled to tidy up which is why he came to Jesus.

As we know Lent gives us an opportunity to "clean up our life's closet" Making sure our inner emotions and feelings are consistent with our outer presentation. We like to present a tidy, righteous appearance to the world, but we all have messy closets full of stuff that we are ashamed of and disappointed in.

When we started our Lenten journey almost 40 days ago, we heard that Jesus would have us clean our whole soul, instead of having secret compartments to keep things we don't want deal with, or closets filled with unrighteous stuff that we want to keep hidden from others but it is not hidden from God!

So, we have had period of preparation, of self-denial, of repentance and confession, of putting our spiritual house in order, so that we can be prepared ourselves for the Easter miracle. What we discover as we make those preparations is that there are so many things that get in the way of our true embrace of the risen Christ. They are habits and preferences and inclinations that clutter our souls. Lent came along to give us time, space, and appropriate reminders that we need to clean house to receive the one we call Lord. To do this well is both a challenging and a fulfilling exercise.

As we celebrate Holy Week this month, we need to be reminded that Easter is not about a single day, a week of spiritual reflection or even forty days of personal sacrifice but rather it is a reminder a lifetime commitment to our renewal and rebirth through the water and the Spirit. Nicodemus continues his rebirth when he chooses to leave behind his life as a Pharisee and become a part, a vital part of the resurrection story of Jesus Christ. Nicodemus joins Joseph of Arimathea in taking Christ's

body from the cross, preparing it and laying it in the tomb. Certainly, his actions ended his old life as part of the Jewish ruling council but without his participation in the events there may not have been the Easter Miracle.

It is not a surprise that Lent and the renewal and rebirth of springtime coincide because the word lent means spring. We should not lose the close connection between the spiritual rebirth and renewal of the Lent and the rebirth and renewal that we see and enjoy in the physical world around us because God's handiwork is visible in both. Friends have we ever needed a spiritual and physical renewal and rebirth more than in these days. The Good News is that both have arrived!

Keep Watch and Pray with Jesus!

We started a custom last year, a custom where it is possible to feel the poignancy of the night that Jesus is betrayed. In essence each of you, the faithful are asked to accompany Jesus, like Peter, James and John, in the Garden and console him during his great agony as He is arrested and the trials of Good Friday begin.

On the night of Maundy Thursday, April 1st I will ask each of you to take on that challenge, to *Keep Watch and Pray* with and for Jesus! I am asking each of you to set aside one hour of time, from 9 PM Thursday until noon Friday, to pray, read and mediate on the scene in the garden that sacred night. Imagine being there with Jesus in the Garden, watching the sweat of blood drip down his face as he prepares to sacrifice himself for our sins. Dear Ones, will you *Keep Watch and Pray* for one hour to appreciate just what Jesus Christ has done for you?

Message: The Miracle of Resurrection

Description: Every day we wake up to the miracle of the resurrection. The resurrection of Jesus Christ is more than a fact and a promise. It is more than a triumph over tragedy, the conquering of the cross and a victory over the grave it is all of that and more. Resurrection is about transformation. It is a life, our life, being transformed and renewed by the power of Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, at work in us and in the world. The Resurrection story is our story, which sustains our living and gives us hope and joy." The thing that makes Christianity different, special and real is not that we worship a person that was good and worthy of respect and that they died doing and being what they could to make a difference in the lives of others but rather that we worship a living savior!

Message: Why Are You Surprised

Description: Peter is still feeling empowered by the Holy Spirit to preach the Gospel story to the world after he gave his first sermon to the Jews at Pentecost and three thousand are saved that day. Peter comes across a lame man at the Temple Gate and heals him with a simple one-word command, *Walk!* The crowd still buzzing from the rousing sermon that Peter gave and now they are amazed at the healing that he has done. But Peter asks Why Are You Surprised? He tells them that what he has done has nothing ti do with his own power but rather through the authority of Jesus Christ. You knew him, you rejected him, you asked that he be killed in the place of a criminal, but now you know that he has fulfilled the prophecies of old, he is the God of your ancestors Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. He has been resurrected by God, we are witnesses to this so *Why Are You Surprised* by what He can do?

April 25: Fourth Sunday of Easter

Scripture: John 10:11 - 18, Acts 4:5 - 12

Message: No Other Name

Description: Peter is arrested because of his acts of healing in last week's lesson and he is hauled before Caiaphas the Jewish leader that masterminded the death of Christ, and Peter is asked In Whose Name do you do these things? Peter replies, by No Other Name than the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, the One you killed on a cross, the One God raised from the dead, the One who still lives today bring salvation for all. It is by means of his name this man stands before you healthy and whole! Friends, In Whose Name do we act in faith, In Whose Name do act with compassion, In Whose Name do we act out of love for a broken soul? That name must *be No Other Name* than Jesus Christ who was crucified, and whom God raised from the dead!
